## How to be safe.

Let's all have a safe season at The 'Creek. Please abide by these simple rules to be a good Farmketeer.

**COVID HYGIENE**—Protect yourself and others as follows:

- (1) Keep a SAFE social distance,
- (2) Wear your MASK when in closer quarters,
- (3) Monitor your CHILDREN to ensure they comply.

**DOGS**—We love dogs, but we do not encourage visitors to bring dogs these days. If you must bring your dog:


- (1) Keep your dog on a LEASH and attended at all times,
- (2) CLEAN up right away and take the waste with you,
- (3) Keep your dog out of the crop FIELDS; orchards only.

Remember, there are often crowds of people and vehicles around. Not everybody is comfortable with dogs. And, nobody (farmer or visitor) wants to step in waste as they wander. Thank you. An arfy woof to you and yours.

Our dogs live here on the farm and mostly lounge around. If they ramble up to you or bark, don't worry, they will not chase you away. Just ignore them if you are unsure.

**DRIVE SLOWWWWLY**—The 'Creek is an active farm. There are people and animals and tractors and potholes and falling apples... lots to watch out for... and not run into. Go slowly. In the parking lot, on farm roads, even in your private fruit farm daydreams. You're on vacation here.

**ORCHARD LADDERS**—Do not climb a ladder if you find one in the orchard; they are for farm crew only. Instead use the short wooden "tripod" stools. Carefully!



# When to pick.

# How to pick.

#### DO ask the stand worker which crops are ready to pick.

There is variation even among varieties of the same fruits and vegetables. For example, yellow peaches versus white peaches, beefsteak tomatoes versus heirloom tomatoes.

#### DO NOT bite a piece of fruit then toss it on the ground.

If you've picked before it is ripe, don't panic. A peach will be ripe in a few days and an apple will continue to sweeten. Take it home and eat it... or give it to your neighbor!

## DO ask for picking tools and return them when done.

Some items are best picked with clippers (eggplant), big loppers (sprouts), or those cool picking sticks (apples).

## DO pick with 2 hands.

Before you pick an apple, steady the branch and the nearby apples with one hand, then gently twist with your picking hand. If you just grab and yank, other apples will

elow. Imagine 500 people

fall and cause a chain reaction below. Imagine 500 people knocking a few apples off each time. Heartbreaking waste.
